



COVID-19 RESPONSE GUIDELINE UPDATES

11.17.2020

The below information was updated in the GSEM COVID-19 Response Guidelines dated 11.17.2020. The information below and the guidelines dated 11.17.2020 supersede all previous editions of the GSEM COVID-19 Response Guidelines.

Beginning on page 10 and throughout the publication – The maximum number of individuals permitted at any Girl Scout meeting or activity has been reduced from 20 to 10. This includes girls, leaders, volunteers needed to meet proper girl-to-adult ratio, parents/caregivers, staff, etc.

Page 13 – Unit capacities at camp have been updated to reflect the new 10-individual maximum while still meeting the established guidelines for overnight use.

The following units are not available for overnight use at this time due to the inability to meet established guidelines for use as established by the CDC/ACA/GSUSA. However, the kitchen shelters for Border Village, Treehouses and Covered Wagons may be reserved for use for day outings.

All other units will operate under a reduced capacity of 10 individuals to match the maximum number of individuals allowed at small gatherings, with the exception of the below units, which have capacities of less than 10:

Boulder Ledges max capacity of 8

Frontier Village max capacity 6
Bunk House max capacity 6
